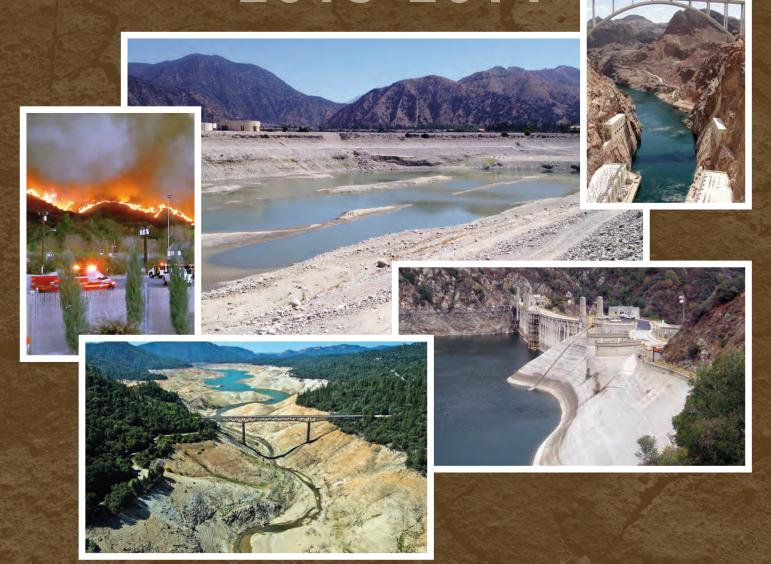

WATERMASTER IS DOING MORE WITH LESS WATER

As the drought lengthens, Watermaster continues to provide adequate water to meet regional needs thanks to many new water programs, conservation by water customers, and the efforts by the entire water community to meet supply needs.

Regional and Municipal Suppliers Are Doing Their Part. Over the past 20 years, Southern California ratepayers have invested more than \$15 billion in regional storage, infrastructure improvements, local resources, and water use efficiency programs that are now serving to sustain supplies. As a result, water ample is available through the Metropolitan Water District and the regional municipal water agencies, with whom Watermaster has collaborated.

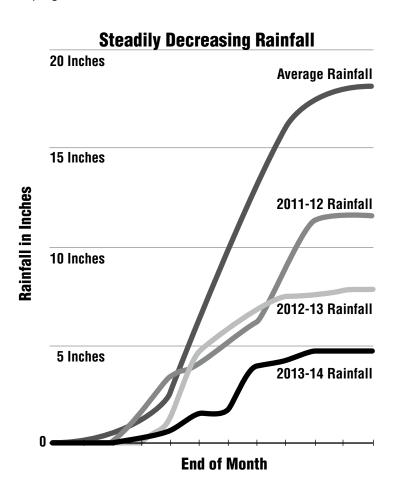
Watermaster is Enhancing and Preserving Regional Supplies More Proactively, Creatively and Productively Than Ever.

This annual report documents the extensive progress made by Watermaster, together with the entire water community to enhance and develop water supplies, using many new tools and programs.

Highlights of Watermaster's 2013-14. Working with the water community, as well as local, state and federal legislators, Watermaster continued to make progress towards building regional water supply independence.

- Established a Reliability Storage Program with a target reserve of 100,000 acre-feet;
- Implemented a new Water Resource Development Assessment to pay for the Reliability Storage Program;
- Paved the way for importing Colorado River water into the Basin, providing additional supplies;
- Set new Operating Safe Yield levels that will help encourage water conservation;
- Expanded outreach efforts to improve consumer conservation;
- Continued to make progress on groundwater cleanup and water quality protection projects.

As we look to the future, Watermaster will continue working with its partners as we progress toward our ultimate goal of increased regional water supply independence.

Watermaster Takes Action on Drought

As California completes its third straight drought year, Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster has been able to meet community water needs even as the state suffers through one of its worst recorded droughts.

IMPORTANCE OF NEW REGIONAL WATER SUPPLY PROGRAMS HIGHLIGHTED BY EXTREME DROUGHT

This year is going into the record books as one of California's driest ever. After three years of drought, reservoirs are low, groundwater is at record-low levels, and forecasts for the coming year's rainfall are not promising.

The extreme weather has highlighted weaknesses in the State and Federal water systems. In November 2013, State Water Project (SWP) allocations were reduced to a record low 5% of requests, while the federal Central Valley Project reduced deliveries down to zero for some junior water rights holders. Later, in January 2014, the SWP was further reduced to zero. Finally, in April 2014, the original allocation of 5% was reinstated with certain conditions.

ONE OF THE WORST RECORDED DROUGHTS HISTORIC GROUNDWATER LOWS BELOW AVERAGE RAINFALL ACROSS THE ENTIRE STATE

Baldwin Park Key Well Groundwater Elevation Operating Range Operating Range Groundwater levels have been receding over time and have plummeted during the current drought to the lowest recorded level of 187.8 feet at the end of June 2014. This increases the importance of Watermaster's current initiatives to increase local and regional water supplies.

WHERE WE GET OUR WATER

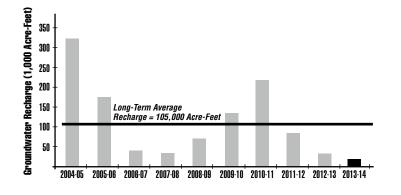
Watermaster is actively developing new water supplies as traditional imported supplies grow increasingly unreliable.

The Basin has become more dependent on groundwater, which provides about 72% of supply, and has seen replenishment water cut in half from 34% to 17% of our supplies.



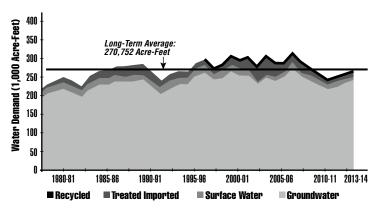
About 76% of our region's water comes from inside the Basin—most, about 90 billion gallons or 72%, from the groundwater Basin.

About 24% of local water is imported. This supply is increasingly unreliable.



STORMWATER CAPTURE PLUMMETS TO LEAST EVER:

Stormwater capture fell for the third year in a row to a record low of approximately 19,700 acre-feet, which is roughly 19% of the 41-year average.



TOTAL WATER DEMAND:

Total water demand has dipped slightly in recent years, but remains steady. New water supply initiatives are critically needed to meet long-term water demand.

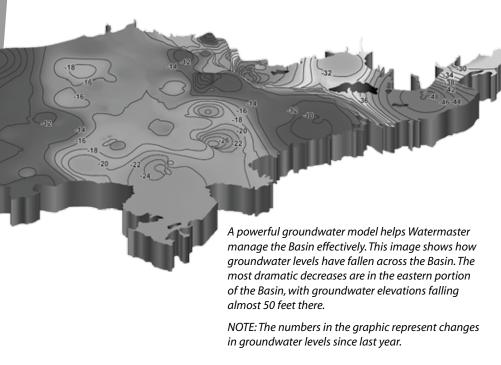

Active Water Management Addresses Drought and Long-Term Supply

This drought reveals what an invaluable resource the Basin's groundwater is: when rainfall is plentiful, the Basin provides storage, which is available during wet and dry periods to meet water needs. The Basin also serves as an excellent conduit for exchanging and storing water to further enhance the ability to meet the region's

water needs.

By approving changes to its rules and regulations, Watermaster is now able to move quickly and flexibly to develop new long-term water supplies and respond to short-term drought conditions.



EXCELLENT GOVERNANCE OF THE BASIN

Effective governance promotes a common understanding of the issues and agreement on the right approaches to take in managing the Basin. For example, this year Watermaster achieved unanimity to implement Water Resource Development Assessment and to lower the safe yield, both of which increase costs for producers in the short term. A willingness to sacrifice, work together, and invest in the future is why this Region's Basin management has been successful.

State Water Project allocations are 5% this year, and virtually all imported Supplemental Water deliveries were halted during calendar years 2007, 2008 and 2009. As a result, a top priority of Watermaster is to make the region more self-sufficient.

NEW RELIABILITY STORAGE PROGRAM AND RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT

By implementing a new Reliability Storage Program to ensure a "banked" supply of water is available to meet the region's needs if supplemental sources are restricted in the future, Watermaster has reduced the risk of groundwater and surface water sources being over-stressed.

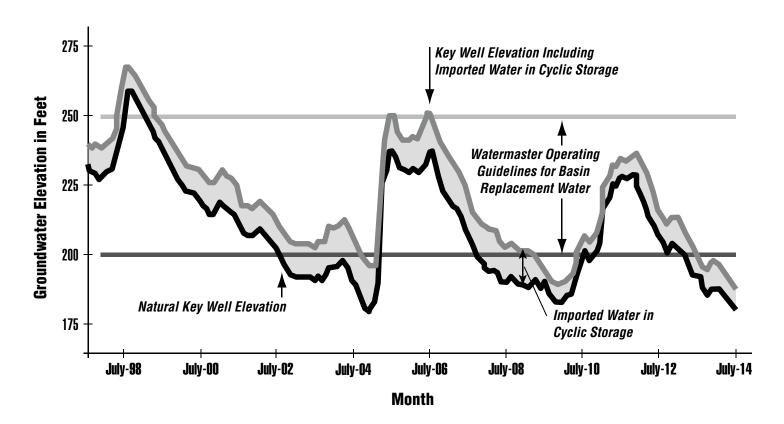
The Goal is to Place 100,000 AF of Imported Water into Reliability Storage Within 10 years. Watermaster is prepared to purchase and store 100,000 acre-feet of Supplemental Water in the Basin in the event Supplemental Water supply deliveries are interrupted again.

Reliability Storage Will be Used and Replaced Only Under Strict Criteria. The water will be used during times of extreme need, such as when State

Water Project or Colorado River aqueduct facilities are damaged, unavailable, or Watermaster is unable to meet at least 50% of Replacement Water needs for two consecutive years.

No Influence on Determining Basin "Health" and Levels. Reliability Storage will be excluded from local water supply levels when characterizing the health of the Basin. It will truly be a separately banked supply for specific urgent needs.

New Resource Development
Assessment. To pay for the Reliability
Storage Program and purchase
Replacement Water, Watermaster
established a Water Resource
Development Assessment of \$20 per
acre-foot to be levied on all water
produced from the Basin beginning
with 2014-15 production.



Cyclic Storage allows for the storage of imported water in the Basin when surplus water is available. The water is used to meet future Supplemental Water requirements, particularly when imported water is in short supply.

The water kept in Cyclic Storage is elevating the groundwater level and providing a critical drought buffer and standby water supply.

NEAR-TERM DROUGHT AND WATER SHORTAGE ACTIONS UNTIL RELIABILITY STORAGE IS IN PLACE

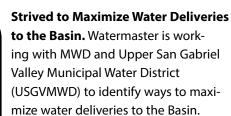
To improve near-term water supplies, Watermaster has taken numerous actions such as those below:

Secured a \$15 Million Line of Credit to Facilitate Pre-Purchases on a Basinwide Scale. (See page 12 for details)

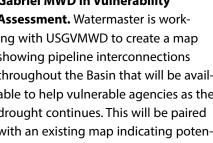
Established Financial Incentives to Encourage Pre-Purchase of Supplemental Water. This new program provides a \$100 price incentive for those that pre-order and prepay for Supplemental Water. The incentive encourages producers to order water early, allowing Watermaster to better predict the amount of pre-purchase water that will be needed, and have the funds available to immediately purchase supply in a very competitive environment.

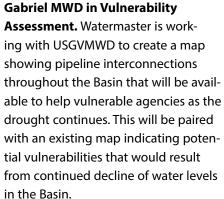
Redrafted Cyclic Storage Agreements with Responsible Agencies to Allow More Flexibility. In collaboration with municipal water districts, Watermaster completed agreements for Metropolitan Water District (MWD) to earmark 140,000 acre feet of water in cyclic storage. There were numerous other cyclic storage actions this year, all helping the region get through the drought.

Worked with Producers to Discuss Water Supply Options. Watermaster is working with the Responsible Agencies to develop a Basinwide drought management plan. The goal is to develop ways of providing water to agencies that are likely to be most impacted by potential low water levels.



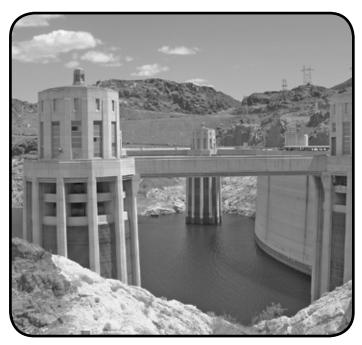

WATERMASTER INITIATIVES TO ENHANCE AND PROTECT THE WATER SUPPLY

Three-Year Purchased Water Plan Enhances Proactive Water Supply Development. The Three-Year Purchased Water Plan helps prepare for future dry periods and imported water shortfalls. It involves looking ahead three years and evaluating a number of criteria to determine how much Supplemental Water will be needed. Criteria include: Key Well projections, rainfall, and other supply statistics in order to plan pre-purchases of imported water. Watermaster purchased approximately 26,000 acre-feet of Supplemental Water in FY 2013-14, the first year of the plan's implementation.

Utilizing Storage and Export and Exchange Agreements to Increase Water Management Flexibility. Recently developed agreements and changes to the Judgment provide criteria to allow water to be stored, as well as imported and exported to and from the Basin. This has facilitated many valuable transfers and agreements; for example, the City of Sierra Madre is outside the Basin but received Basin water through an emergency connection with MWD because the drought decreased water levels in their area to the point where their wells could no longer operate.

Operating Safe Yield Decreased. The Operating Safe Yield (OSY) was decreased to 150,000 acre-feet for 2014-15. This compares to a long-term average OSY of about 195,000 acrefeet. The larger the OSY, the more water can be pumped by Producers without paying a Replacement Water Assessment. The substantial reduction in the OSY reflects the impact of the drought and will increase incentives to save water and seek alternative sources. It is expected that the OSY level will remain lower than average in the near future due to lack of rainfall.

Additional Supply of Colorado River Water Requested.

Due to the low State Water Project allocation and to provide water requested by Producers for Cyclic Storage accounts and Replacement, Watermaster was asked to take delivery of Colorado River Water for Supplemental Water. The offer was accepted contingent on resolution of water quality, Quagga Mussel and delivery concerns.

Stormwater Capture Projects Completed, More Planned.

In recent years, Watermaster worked with LA County Flood Control to develop and implement stormwater capture projects to improve groundwater recharge in the Basin. Three projects have been successfully completed and more are planned.

Protecting and Preserving Basin Water Quality

Watermaster, along with the Water Quality Authority, local water producers, legislators, regulators and local industry have worked effectively together to raise hundreds of millions of dollars to build and operate treatment plants, research new cleanup technologies, and clean up the Basin so that it will always provide quality water to customers.

EVALUATE DRILLING AND DESTRUCTION OF WELLS TO PROTECT SUPPLY AND QUALITY

After several decades of difficult work, the entire water community has developed collaborative roles and relationships that are allowing them to effectively tackle the complex legal, technical, financial and regulatory challenges of cleaning up and protecting water quality in the Main San Gabriel Basin.

COMPLETED REGIONAL HEALTH GOAL REQUIREMENT

Watermaster prepared public health goal reviews for 10 water systems in the Basin to identify contaminants associated with human health risks, available water treatment technologies, and estimates of costs to bring contaminant levels down to Public Health Goal levels.

COMMENTED ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS FOR HEXAVALENT CHROMIUM

With an eye toward reducing costs of California public health requirements for water quality monitoring, Watermaster performed sampling throughout the Basin for levels of Chromium 6, in advance of the regulation going into effect, thus "getting ahead" of the health department's anticipated sampling requirements. Regional testing lowers costs, gives a broader view of water quality issues, and allows local agencies to prepare in advance and not be caught off-guard by regulations.

COMPLETED SALT AND NUTRIENT PLAN

The draft Salt and Nutrient Plan was completed after four years of work. It demonstrates that Watermaster has effectively managed salts in past decades, and there remains a sufficient capacity to assimilate additional salts. This study allowed Watermaster to consider the import of Colorado River water—which is high in salts this year, and will make it possible to expand recycled water use.

COMPLETED RECYCLED WATER RECHARGE PROJECT STUDY

Watermaster completed studies to identify how much recycled water can be assimilated safely into the Basin and is reviewing findings with project partners and regulators.

Watermaster conducted monthly inspections of local landfills, and they were all found to operate consistent with the conditions under each landfill's permit.

HELPED OBTAIN GENERAL DISCHARGE PERMIT

Critically Needed Step for Continued Water Quality Testing and Treatment. Following years of work spearheaded by the Water Quality Authority, a General Discharge Permit was obtained from regulators, allowing increased flexibility to facilitate construction and testing of new wells and treatment facilities. Watermaster's role was to coordinate the actual discharge and work with producers, LA County Flood Control, and others.

CONTINUED PROGRESS ON OPERABLE UNIT CLEANUP

Extensive Baldwin Park Operable Unit (BPOU) Duties as Project Administrator

As project administrator for the BPOU, Watermaster continues to be responsible for maintaining project accounting, performing project monitoring, and reporting activities. Watermaster's role includes cost management, risk management, and other activities, some provided through contract consultants. All costs to Watermaster related to BPOU services are fully reimbursed by the Cooperating Respondents.

BPOU Sampling and Evaluation Program. Watermaster is also charged with sampling of BPOU extraction wells, other selected production wells within the area, and various multi-port monitoring wells.

No Increase In Performance Sampling Costs.

The Performance Sampling and Evaluation Program is carried out by Watermaster to evaluate the effectiveness of the BPOU remedy.

Continue Air Quality Monitoring for BPOU. Watermaster provides air quality monitoring for the BPOU, and the contract was renewed with no increase in costs for the coming fiscal year.

Completed Negotiations for the Eighth Amendment to the BPOU Project Agreement. Following extensive consultation with the BPOU parties, the latest amendment to the BPOU Project Agreement was fully executed.

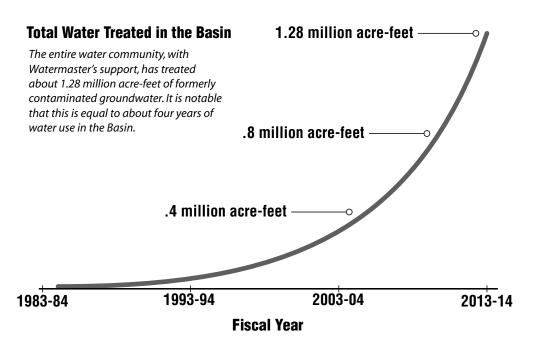
Evaluated Ways to Dispose of Resin. Two options are under discussion about how to dispose of spent resin from the BPOU water treatment facilities. A number of issues are being evaluated, including cost, long-term liability, and insurance coverage.

Working With Department of Toxic Substances Control at Whittier Narrows Operable Unit (WNOU)

A production agreement between Watermaster and USEPA allowed water from the WNOU to be used beneficially rather than simply discharging it into the River. This agreement was transferred to the state Department of Toxic Substances Control during the past year to facilitate a smooth transfer.

Approved El Monte Operable Unit (EMOU) **Production Agreement**

Because the extracted contaminated groundwater at the EMOU is being treated and then immediately re-injected into the aquifer, Watermaster has included a maximum assessment amount in the Production Agreement.

COLLABORATED ON HABITAT DESIGNATION FOR SANTA ANA SUCKER

In cooperation with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, Watermaster filed an amicus brief relative to the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) Critical Habitat Designation for the Santa Ana Sucker. The brief addresses numerous concerns, including economic and water supply impacts.

PARTICIPATED IN REGIONAL EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Financial Participation for Education Regarding the National Park Service National Recreation Area Federal Designation. Watermaster joined a regional effort to provide public education about the potential impacts on water rights and water supply from the proposed National Recreation Area Designation. Watermaster attended meetings to educate legislators and provided technical comments through the process.

Participated in Public Service Campaign "San Gabriel Water Wise."

Watermaster participated in a four-part public service announcement campaign hosted by State Senator Ed Hernandez, D-West Covina.

Watermaster is Working with Basin Partners to Deliver a Strong Conservation Message. Watermaster, working with the San Gabriel Valley Water Association, has been educating producers and users on water conservation and outside agency awareness efforts.

Passed Conservation Resolution. All Basin Producers were alerted to the critical water supply shortage. Producers were strongly encouraged to implement measures to promote water conservation needed to achieve a reduction goal of 20% of average annual demands.

Made Presentations to Community Groups. Presented on the Water Resource Development Assessment to the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments, and at the University of Southern California's Price School of Public Policy's Groundwater Strategy Workshop, along with the Responsible Agencies.

Participated In a Panel On Fracking. Watermaster participated in a panel discussion on fracking and its potential impacts to the Main San Gabriel Basin with Assemblyman Chris Holden, D-Pasadena.



JOINED REGIONAL AND STATEWIDE DROUGHT AND WATER SUPPLY PROGRAMS

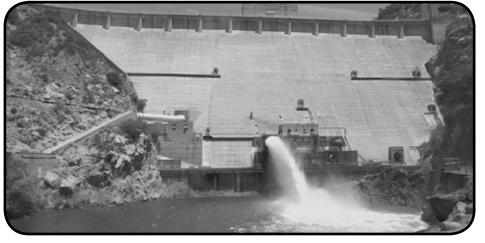
Reviewed and Supported Statewide Water Action Plan. A resolution was prepared in support of the Association of California Water Agencies' (ACWA) Statewide Water Action Plan. ACWA emphasized integrated resource management planning, local groundwater management, increased water storage, surface water storage and project streamlining.

Moderated Panel at American Groundwater Trust/Association of Ground Water Agencies Conference.

The panel considered legal aspects of adjudicated basins, including specifically the Main Basin and the importance of flexibility created by the 2012 Judgment Amendments.

Reviewed Groundwater Workplan Concept Paper. Watermaster reviewed the Groundwater Workplan Concept Paper prepared by the State Water Resources Control Board and provided comment.

Surveyed Producers to Anticipate Drought Impacts. Surveys were distributed to Producers to collect the most current data regarding well configurations in order to ensure that the poten-

tial drought impacts are fully anticipated. It also requested information about historic sources of supply, increased costs to address drought, well modification costs, ability to receive treated water in lieu of pumping, and more.

Approved the County Integrated Regional Water Management

Plan (IRWMP). Watermaster currently holds two seats on the IRWMP Leadership Committee: Groundwater Representative, and Chair of the Upper San Gabriel and Rio Hondo River Sub-Region.

Participated in Funding Upgrades to Morris Dam. Watermaster helped secure funding through the IRWMP to rebuild valves at Morris Dam to allow water to be drawn from the dam when it is at very low levels.

Working With Municipal Water Agencies on Drought Planning.

Watermaster is working with Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (USGVMWD) on drought planning and messaging.



PARTICIPATED IN WATER FORUM

Watermaster participated in, sponsored and presented at the Water Forum. This annual event brings together the water community, educators, students, business people, elected officials, labor union representatives, community leaders, residents, and environmentalists.

Efficient Management Reduces Costs

Watermaster constantly strives to refine its technical operations, administration and financial activities. Continuous oversight of its management actions by the Executive Officer, Board, and Committees ensures that the water agencies in the San Gabriel Valley are served by an efficient organization.

OBTAINED LINE OF CREDIT FOR \$15 MILLION TO FUND WATER PURCHASES

The Credit Line Assists Water Purveyors in Supply Purchases. The line of credit with Citizens Business Bank is the first of its kind in water management. Before the line of credit is used, Watermaster must manage reserve funds and meet certain criteria described in the policy.

SET IN-LIEU ASSESSMENT

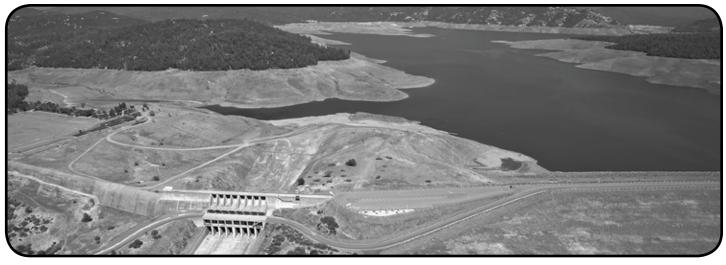
The In-Lieu Assessment was set at \$2.05 per acre-foot on fiscal year 2013-14 production. It provides funding for Watermaster's share of the Cooperative Water Exchange Agreement (Alhambra Exchange).

ADMINISTRATION BUDGET AND ASSESSMENT INCREASED

Watermaster adopted an Administration Budget of \$4.57 million for Fiscal Year 2014-15, up from \$4.1 million for 2012-13, an increase of 8.6 percent.

Areas of Higher than Budgeted Costs. A \$50,000 contribution to the San Gabriel Valley Water Association to expand education on the proposed National Recreation Area Designation was one area of increased costs. Other areas of higher-than-budgeted expenses include: one-time costs of establishing the new \$15 million line of credit, purchase of new replacement computer equipment and office furniture, as well as costs of developing a new employee handbook.

Areas of Lower Than Budgeted Costs. Salaries and benefits were 26% lower than expected due to fully funded vacant positions. Engineering expenses came in lower than budgeted by approximately 10.4%. Legal expenses for the year were 52% lower than budgeted due to less than anticipated activities in the areas of the Santa Ana Sucker and Southwestern Willow Flycatcher Critical Habitat designations.

ORGANIZATIONAL REVIEW COMPLETED AND IMPROVEMENTS IMPLEMENTED

Digitized Letterhead to Reduce Printing Costs and Waste.Creating and distributing 100% digital documents saves money, decreases staff workload, and is environmentally superior.

Service List Edits Lower Costs. Watermaster reviewed its electronic service list, and was able to eliminate people who had been on the list for years and even decades, but were no longer involved, or interested, in Watermaster activities. This action, made possible by the 2012 Judgment Amendments, will result in continued cost and time savings.

Streamlined Invoicing Procedures. Invoicing procedures have been streamlined to save time and maintain accuracy of records across multiple computer programs.

Filing and Archiving Improvements. Improving the efficiency and organization of the physical and digital filing system has begun and will continue in fiscal year 2014-15.

Employee Assistance Program Implemented. Following research and evaluation of costs and benefits, an Employee Assistance Program was implemented that provides employees with resources to address daily personal and workplace issues. It also provides management with additional tools to foster a safe and welcoming workplace environment at a minimal cost.

HENRY PELLISIER HONORED



As the head of a prominent farming family, Henry Pelissier was an early leader in understanding the importance of water to the region and the necessity for thoughtful, long-term management actions.

Recognizing that the Basin was already in overdraft, Mr. Pellisier was involved in the beginnings of the adjudication process as early as 1962.

He remained active in water and was a regular participant at Watermaster meetings until recently.

Watermaster, the court, the Basin and the entire public owe a debt of gratitude to Mr. Pellisier for his decades of farsighted and generous water leadership, and wish him well in his much deserved retirement.

SUMMARY OF WATERMASTER ACTIONS FISCAL YEAR 2013-14

Cyclic Storage

On September 4, 2013, Watermaster authorized the purchase of 10,000 acre-feet of cyclic storage water from Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (USGVMWD) for San Gabriel Valley Water Company's individual producer cyclic storage account.

On September 4, 2013, Watermaster authorized the purchase of 1,300 acre-feet of cyclic storage water from Three Valleys Municipal Water District (TVMWD) and 200 acre-feet of cyclic storage water from USGVMWD, for the City of Glendora's individual producer cyclic storage account.

On October 2, 2013, Watermaster authorized execution of an amendment extending the cyclic storage agreement with Metropolitan Water District (MWD)/TVMWD for five years, through June 30, 2018.

On October 2, 2013, Watermaster authorized execution of an amendment extending the cyclic storage agreement with MWD/USGVMWD for five years, through June 30, 2018.

On November 6, 2013, Watermaster opened the public comment period and set January 8, 2014 as the public hearing date for the Draft 5-Year Water Quality and Supply Plan. Notice of this public hearing was advertised in accordance with the Judgment.

Annual Report Completed

During October, 2013, in accordance with Section 36 of the Judgment, Watermaster prepared an Annual Report and filed it with the Court and Parties by November 1, 2013.

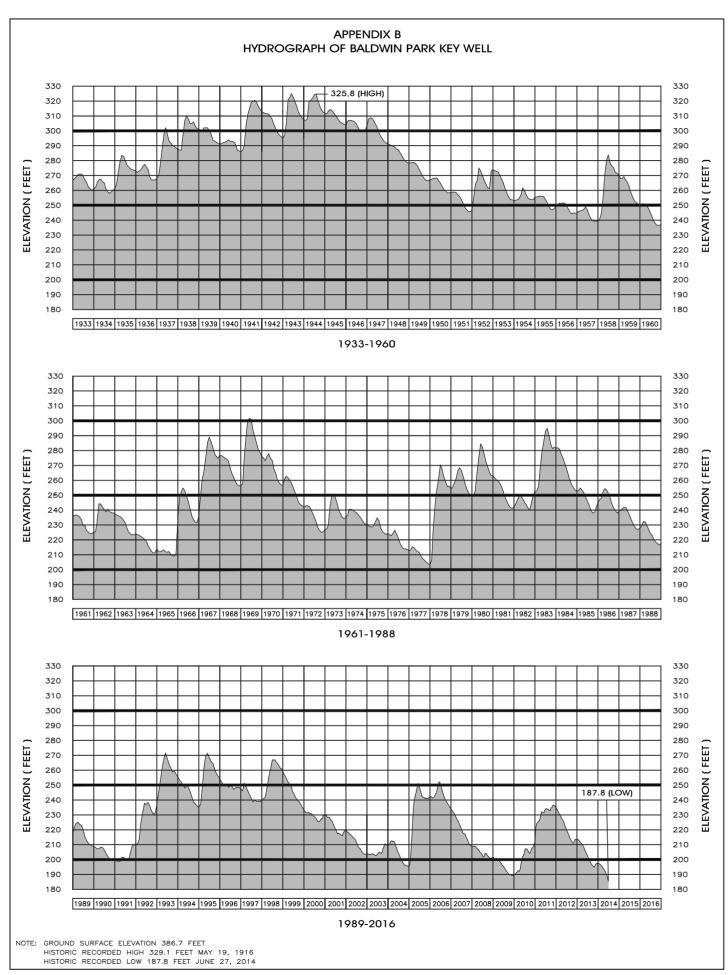

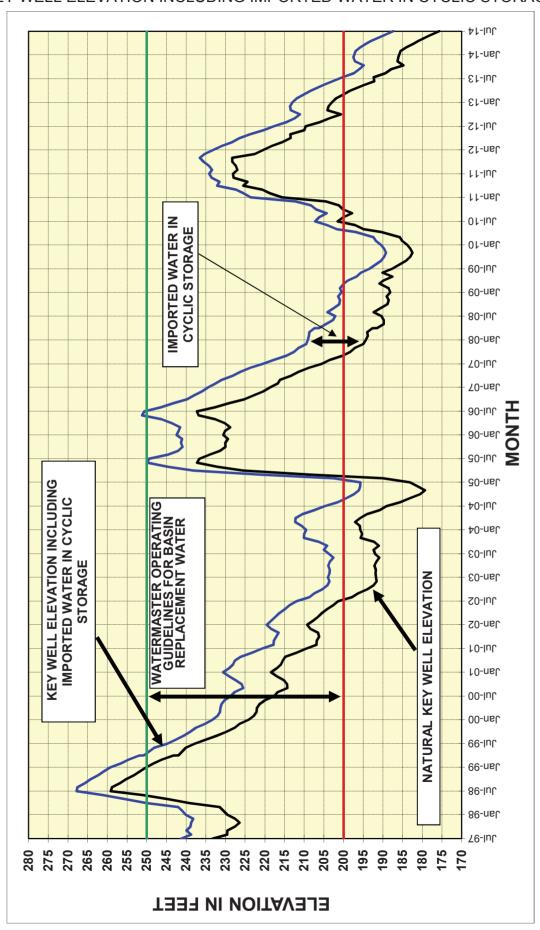

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Pursuant to the Judgment in <u>Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District v. City of Alhambra, et al.</u> and its Exhibit J, Puente Narrows Agreement, the subsurface flow passing from Puente Basin to the Main San Gabriel Basin was determined for fiscal year 2013-14. This determination of subsurface flow was made in accordance with Appendix C, Engineering Criteria, to Exhibit J of the Judgment and consisted of measuring the water levels at the two key wells.

The field measurements of the water levels at the upstream well, 2S/10W-9Q, and downstream well, 2S/10W-8E3, for Fall 2013 were collected on October 8, 2013 by Mr. Tuan Nguyen of Stetson Engineers Inc. representing Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and Mr. Charlie Devine of Civiltec Engineering Inc. representing Puente Basin Water Agency. The field measurements of the water levels at the upstream well, 2S/10W-9Q, and downstream well, 2S/10W-8E3, for Spring 2014 were collected on April 3, 2014 by Mr. Tuan Nguyen of Stetson Engineers Inc. representing Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District and Mr. Charlie Devine of Civiltec Engineering Inc. representing Puente Basin Water Agency. Based on the Fall 2013 and Spring 2014 static water levels at the key wells, the subsurface flow was determined to be 985 acre-feet for fiscal year 2013-14, as shown on Table 1.

Field inspections of the concrete-lined San Jose Creek channel were made concurrently with the field water level measurements and indicated no apparent withdrawal of flow in the San Jose Creek channel from the boundary of Spadra Basin with Puente Basin and downstream to Puente Narrows.

The Puente Narrows Agreement requires that a perpetual accounting of the subsurface flow through Puente Narrows be maintained. Presented in Table 2 is the accounting to date, showing the Accumulated Base Underflow (at 580 acre-feet per year in accordance with Paragraph 8 of the Agreement), the Annual and Accumulated Subsurface Flow to date under the Agreement, the Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency and the Adjusted Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency (from Table 3).

By Agreement dated November 30, 1989, Puente Basin Water Agency and Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District agreed that groundwater extracted from Puente Basin that is treated and discharged to the lined channel, and then percolated in the Main Basin as part of Carrier Corporation's cleanup program, which is required by the Regional Water Quality Control Board, shall be credited to

Puente Agency as subsurface outflow from Puente Basin. Evaporation losses and unusable surface outflow to the ocean are deducted from such groundwater extraction from Puente Basin. As shown on Table 3, Column 6, since fiscal-year 2007-08, Carrier stopped discharging this treated water and the water is being beneficially used in the Puente Basin.

Table 3 summarizes the adjustment to subsurface outflow due to Carrier Corporation's discharges. Table 3 shows the Groundwater Extraction for Cleanup Purposes, Deliveries to Rowland Water District, Discharge to Sanitary Sewer, Total Evaporation Losses, Unusable Outflow to Ocean, Annual Cleanup Extraction Credit, accumulated Annual Cleanup Extraction Credit, Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency (from Table 2), and the Adjusted Accumulated Credit or Debit of Puente Agency.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS June 30, 2014

Background

The Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster was created by the Los Angeles Superior Court through a stipulated judgment (LASC Case 924128) to administer water rights and manage the Main San Gabriel Groundwater Basin. The Judgment prescribes Watermaster's authorities and specifies five classes of water production assessments to be used to fund certain activities. Those assessment categories are: Administration, Make-up Water, Replacement Water, In-Lieu, and Water Resource Development Costs. Each class of assessment has a prescribed purpose and water production base. Assessment revenue is Watermaster's principal source of income.

Watermaster's Administrative Fund includes funds for administrative expense as budgeted each year, along with money collected through the In-Lieu Assessment and a Special Administrative Assessment collected in 1991-1992 to help pay for groundwater clean-up activities.

The Make-up Water Fund is money collected to purchase Make-up Water for the Lower Area (Central Basin) as part of the Long Beach Judgment. This assessment has been suspended for several years due to a water accounting credit. These funds are held in anticipation of a future obligation to the Lower Area.

The Replacement Water Fund is an assessment collected to purchase imported water to cover any production in excess of production rights as established with the Annual Operating Safe Yield.

During FY 2013-14, Watermaster adopted Resolution No. 09-13-257 declaring its intention to create a Water Resource Development Assessment as a source of money to pre-purchase water for basin storage and reliability. On May 14, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution No. 05-14-263 establishing the Water Resource Development Assessment for implementation on all FY 2014-15 production.

Summary of Financial Information

For the year ending June 30, 2014, Watermaster's Total Assets increased by 1.2% to \$21.169 million, including an increase of 1.7% in Net Assets to \$20.054 million. The Administrative Fund had a Net Increase of \$1.053 million primarily due to a reduction in Legal Expenses and Salaries/Benefits. The Replacement Fund had a Net Loss of \$678K as a result of pre-purchases of replacement water in advance of obligation and expenditures relating to the establishment of the credit line.

Long-Term Liabilities increased for the Other Postemployment Benefits (OPEB) (\$167K in 2012-13 to \$234K in 2013-14) due to the required "implicit rate subsidy" that creates an agency liability, for its retirees on the agency's group health insurance who have not yet reached the Medicare eligibility age. Currently, the Watermaster funds for retiree health benefits on a pay-as-you-go basis through annual salary Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA), but has annually set aside monies earmarked for the payment of future retiree health benefits. Watermaster currently holds 80% of the projected Accumulated Postretirement Benefit Obligation.

MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS June 30, 2014

(continued)

Review of Revenues and Expenses

The Administrative Assessment revenue increased from the prior year due to an increase in the assessment from \$13 per acre-foot (AF) to \$15 per AF, higher production (235,649.80 AF assessed in FY 2012-13 vs. 241,243.74 AF assessed in FY 2013-14), and an increase in Administrative Reimbursements for the Raymond Basin Management Board contract renewal. Operating revenues in the Replacement Water Fund were approximately 97% higher in FY 2013-14 due to individual producer cyclic storage purchases. Also, in FY 2013-14, the amount of money collected for Replacement Water Obligations posted considerably lower because many Producers elected to use cyclic storage to offset replacement water obligations.

While the In-Lieu Assessment remained unchanged from FY 2012-13 to FY 2013-14, the net balance increased by 2.4% due to higher overall production and lower expenditures for the Alhambra Exchange. Money collected through this program will be used to offset additional program expenses going into FY 2014-15.

Comparison of FY 2013-14 Administration Budget to Actual Revenues and Expenses

Administrative Assessment revenue came in higher than the budgeted amount due to increased water production. Settlement income was not anticipated during the budget preparation, yet \$23K was received.

Overall, Engineering and related expenses came in lower than budget by approximately 10.4%. Staff budgeted for anticipated single year increases in the area of Water Quality Monitoring to address the proposed changes in the Chromium 6 MCL regulations.

Legal expenses for the year were 52% lower than budgeted due to less than anticipated activities in the areas of the Santa Ana Sucker and Southwestern Willow Flycatcher Critical Habitat Designations. The US Government shutdown this fiscal year delayed discussions on these issues.

Areas of higher than budgeted expenditures include an increase in Office Supplies & Services of 51% relating to replacement of office furniture and work with an outside Consultant to update Watermaster's Employee Handbook; a 27% increase in the Computer & Office Equipment budget due to the purchase of a new memory drive for the computer system server; and a 230% increase in Public Education resulting from a \$50K contribution to the SGVWA relating to expanded education on the proposed National Recreation Area (NRA) Designation in the San Gabriel River Watershed.

Budget savings were seen in several areas including Salaries & Benefits posting 26% lower than expected due to fully funded vacant positions; and Printing expenses came in about 22% lower with the implementation of electronic delivery of materials. The funding approved for Building Improvements will be carried over into FY 14-15 as the tenant improvement plans are currently being drafted with construction expected by the end of the calendar year.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Nature of Activities

In a judgment dated January 4, 1973, in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Los Angeles, the court established the Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster (Watermaster), which administers the judgment. One of the functions of Watermaster is to levy and collect funds to pay the City of Long Beach, the City of Compton and the Central Basin Municipal Water District for make-up water to replace water used in the San Gabriel Basin which the lower area maintained was properly theirs. The payments have been made for several years through the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District as a result of a negotiated agreement in 1965 and reaffirmed by a validation suit in the same year. The collections and disbursements of this fund are accounted for in the Make-up Obligation Fund.

Watermaster also levies and collects funds to purchase replacement water for Basin overproduction. These collections and disbursements are accounted for in the Replacement Water Fund.

All financial transactions, other than those which fall within the Make-Up Obligation Fund or Replacement Water Fund, are recorded in the Administrative Fund. Assessments are made annually.

Watermaster proposed amendments to its judgment to provide greater flexibility in carrying out its purpose. The judgment amendment was approved by the court on June 21, 2012.

B. Basis of Accounting and Financial Statement Presentation

The accompanying financial statements are prepared under the accrual method of accounting using accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Watermaster incorporates proprietary fund accounting which is similar to the principles applied to a business in the private sector. Revenues earned and expenses incurred are recognized and classified on an accrual basis. The measurement focus is on determination of financial position, changes in net assets and cash flows.

Watermaster classifies its net assets into two categories as described below:

Restricted - This component of net assets consists of restraints placed on net asset use through external constraints imposed by grantors, contributors, or laws and regulations of other governments or constraints imposed by law through constitutional provisions or enabling legislation.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2014 and 2013

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

B. Basis of Accounting and Financial Statement Presentation (continued)

Unrestricted - This component of net assets consists of net assets that do not meet the definition of "restricted."

C. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist primarily of short-term investments which have a maturity of ninety days or less. At June 30, 2014 and 2013, Watermaster invested with the State Treasurer's Local Agency Investment Fund. This is a pooled money investment account with no restrictions on access to funds and therefore is considered a cash equivalent.

Cash and cash equivalents at June 30, 2014 and 2013 include \$186,156 and \$154,505, respectively, that the board designated for future other postretirement benefit obligations.

D. Accounts Receivable

All receivables are considered collectible, thus, no allowance for doubtful accounts is reflected in the balance sheet. Watermaster grants unsecured credit to water producers, all of whom operate in the San Gabriel Valley.

E. Due From BPOU Committee

Watermaster, along with six other water agencies, entered an agreement for groundwater cleanup in the Baldwin Park Operable Unit (BPOU). Under the agreement, responsible parties agreed to pay toward research, cost recovery, treatment plant construction and operating expenses in the cleanup effort. Watermaster bills the responsible parties and collects the funds. Due from BPOU committee receivable is considered fully collectible. The agreement specifies that if the responsible parties fail to make the required payment, Watermaster is entitled to be reimbursed by the Trustee.

F. Capital Assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost and Watermaster's capitalization threshold is \$2,500. Furniture and equipment are being depreciated on the straight-line method over estimated useful lives ranging from 3 to 10 years. Depreciation expense for the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 were \$4,580 and \$5,539, respectively.

G. Income Taxes

On July 31, 1981, Watermaster received a ruling from the Internal Revenue Service exempting it from federal income taxes. A similar ruling was received from the California State Franchise Tax Board on October 16, 1981.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS June 30, 2014 and 2013

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

G. Income Taxes (continued)

US GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by Watermaster and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if an uncertain position has been taken that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. Management has analyzed the tax positions taken by Watermaster, and has concluded that as of June 30, 2014, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The primary tax positions evaluated are related to Watermaster's continued qualification as a tax-exempt organization. The statute of limitations for federal and California purposes is generally three and four years, respectively.

H. Classification of Revenue

Operating revenues are earned by levying and collecting assessments from the producers based upon their amounts of production during the preceding fiscal year. These assessments are applied primarily to the purchase of replacement water and to administrative costs. Nonoperating revenues are those derived primarily from investment income.

I. Use of Estimates

In preparing financial statements in conformity with US GAAP, management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - CASH DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

Custodial Credit Risk

Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the event of a bank failure, Watermaster's deposits may not be returned to it. Watermaster does not have a deposit policy for custodial credit risk. Deposits in financial institutions, reported as components of cash, were fully insured by depository insurance or secured by collateral held by the pledging financial institutions and trust department in Watermaster's name.

Investment Interest Rate Risk

Watermaster has an investment policy that limits investment maturities to no more than five years as a means of managing its exposure to fair value losses arising from increasing interest rates.

NOTE 2 - CASH DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS (continued)

Investment Credit Risk

Watermaster's formal investment policy limits its investment choices to the following:

- 1) Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF)
- 2) U.S. Treasury and Agency Obligations
- 3) Fully insured Certificates of Deposit
- 4) Investment in local water quality and supply projects, associated with Basin cleanup objectives, through the borrowing of funds from the Make-up Water Fund.

Concentration of Investment Credit Risk

Watermaster's formal investment policy limits any one type of investment to no more than 25% of the total portfolio, except for LAIF or U.S. Treasury and Agency Obligations.

NOTE 4 - OPERATING LEASES

Watermaster leases office space from the city of Azusa under a year to year lease agreement which commenced on July 21, 1995 and is renewable for the next 55 years. Rent expense for the years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013 were \$80,250 and \$81,078, respectively.

Watermaster has renewed the lease for the following year with the same monthly base payments totaling \$66,931 for the year ending July 30, 2015. In addition, Watermaster is required to pay additional rent monthly based on a percentage of management and operating expenses.

NOTE 5 - PENSION PLAN

Plan Description and Provisions

Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster contributes to the California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS), a cost-sharing multiple-employer public employee defined benefit pension plan. CalPERS provides retirement and disability benefits, annual cost-of-living adjustments, and death benefits to plan members and beneficiaries. CalPERS acts as a common investment and administrative agent for participating public entities within the State of California. Watermaster is grouped with other entities with similar benefits in the same cost-sharing plan. Benefit provisions and all other requirements are established by state statute and Watermaster resolutions. Copies of CalPERS' annual financial report may be obtained from their executive office: 400 P Street, Sacramento, CA 95814.

Funding Policy and Annual Pension Cost

The Public Employees' Pension Reform Act of 2013 (PEPRA) introduced a new class of Member (New Members) and defined different assumptions and benefits for these New Members than those used for continuing members (Classic Members).

Classic Members are required to contribute 7% of their annual covered salary and New Members are required to contribute 6.25% of their annual covered salary. Watermaster makes the contributions required of the Classic Members on their behalf and for their account but does not make the contributions required of the new members. Watermaster is required to contribute annually at actuarially determined rates; the current rates are 10.781% and 6.25% of annual covered payroll for Classic Members and New Members, respectively. The contribution requirements of plan members and Watermaster are established and may be amended by CalPERS. For fiscal year ended June 30, 2014, Watermaster's annual pension cost of \$146,035 for CalPERS was equal to Watermaster's required and actual contributions. The required contribution rate for 2014-15 is 11.522%.

Funded Status:

The following information summarized the funded status of the risk pool as of June 30, 2012, the most recent actuarial valuation date available. Changes to the pool that will occur as a result of PEPRA are not reflected in this valuation. The impact of most of the PEPRA changes will first show up in the assumptions and the benefit provision listings of the June 30, 2013, valuation for the 2015-16 rates.

NOTE 6 - POSTRETIREMENT HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN

Watermaster provides medical coverage to eight active employees and one retired employee through the Association of California Water Agencies/Joint Powers Insurance Authority (ACWA/JPIA) Health Program. At retirement, Watermaster provides a contribution for the continuation of medical coverage for eligible retirees. For employees hired prior to January 1, 2013, eligibility for a Watermaster contribution requires retirement from Watermaster under PERS on or after age 55 with at least 10 years of full-time service. For employees hired after January 1, 2013, eligibility for a Watermaster contribution requires retirement from Watermaster under PERS on or after age 62 with at least 10 years of full-time service. Watermaster provides for a contribution equal to a 100% of the cost of medical coverage for the retiree if electing retiree only coverage and 50% of the cost of medical coverage if electing coverage for the retiree and eligible dependents. Benefits are payable until the retiree's attained of age 65.

Watermaster currently finances benefits on a pay as you go basis. Although the plan has no segregated assets, Watermaster does maintain funds in LAIF that are designated for retiree health care costs. At June 30, 2014, the fund's designated balance was \$186,156.

NOTE 7 - CONTINGENCY

In August of 2009, Watermaster became aware of two claims asserted against it by the Cooperating Respondents under the Baldwin Park Operable Unit Project Agreement. While Watermaster's investigation of the two new claims continues, it is unaware of any legal basis for or facts that support these claims and intends to vigorously contest any such assertion of liability by the Cooperating Respondents. Management is unable to predict the outcome or estimate the amount or range of the potential loss.

NOTE 8 - SETTLEMENT INCOME

During the fiscal years ended June 30, 2014 and 2013, Watermaster received payments of \$22,500 and \$123,553, respectively, from American International Specialty Lines Insurance Company (AISLIC) as settlement of past legal fees incurred by Watermaster in its defense against third-party claims associated with the ongoing South El Monte Operable Unit litigation. AISLIC, the parent company of American Global Insurance Company, had previously denied Watermaster's claim for defense costs; however, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2008, Watermaster prevailed in its request to the court for summary judgment, prompting the settlement action.

NOTE 9 - LINE OF CREDIT

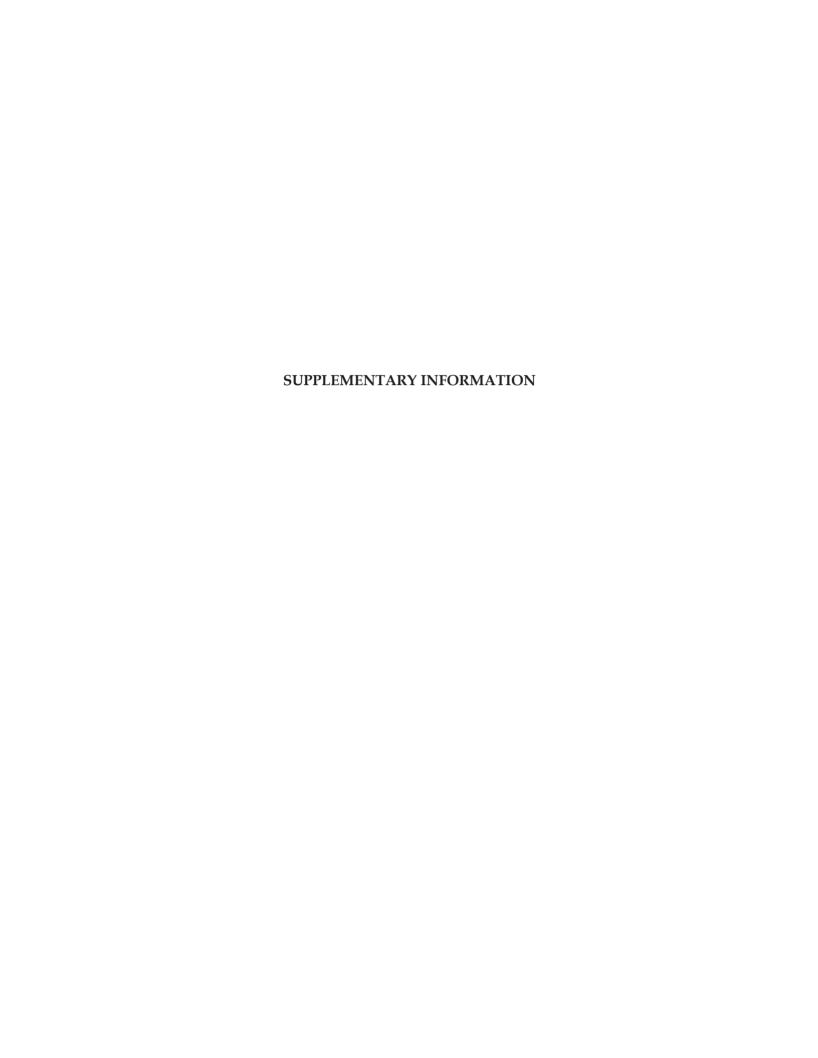
Watermaster has a \$15,000,000 revolving line of credit agreement with a bank. Borrowings are to be used solely for the purpose of purchasing (including pre-purchasing) of replacement water. The line of credit expires October 31, 2014. Watermaster has the option to select interest rates at the time of the draw between prime reference rate plus 3.25% or LIBOR plus 2.25%. All outstanding borrowings are secured by virtually all assets of Watermaster. There was no outstanding balance as of June 30, 2014.

Borrowings under the line of credit are subject to certain financial covenants and restrictions. As of the year ended June 30, 2014, Watermaster was in compliance with all covenants.

NOTE 10 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Pursuant to the June 21, 2012 judgment, Watermaster has adopted Resolution No. 05-14-263 which established a Water Resource Development Assessment (RDA) on all water produced from the Basin. This assessment is intended to aid Watermaster in the purchase and storage of 100,000 acrefeet of supplemental water to address potential future replacement water obligations in the event supplemental water supplies are interrupted in the future. The RDA will be evaluated annually and assessed over a ten year period ending with the 2023-24 fiscal year. Water stored under this program can be used only by action from the Board under one or more of the following conditions: Watermaster's inability to deliver at least 50 percent of basin replacement Water for two consecutive years; damage to State Water Project or Colorado River aqueduct facilities; the implementation of a drought allocation penalty rate for the purchase of replacement water. Water stored under this program will not have any influence of the determination of safe operating yields. The RDA rate is established at \$20 per acre-foot for the 2014-15 fiscal year. Future rates will be established annually by the Watermaster Board.

Watermaster has evaluated subsequent events through September 9, 2014, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. All subsequent events requiring recognition or disclosure as of September 9, 2014, have been incorporated into these financial statements.

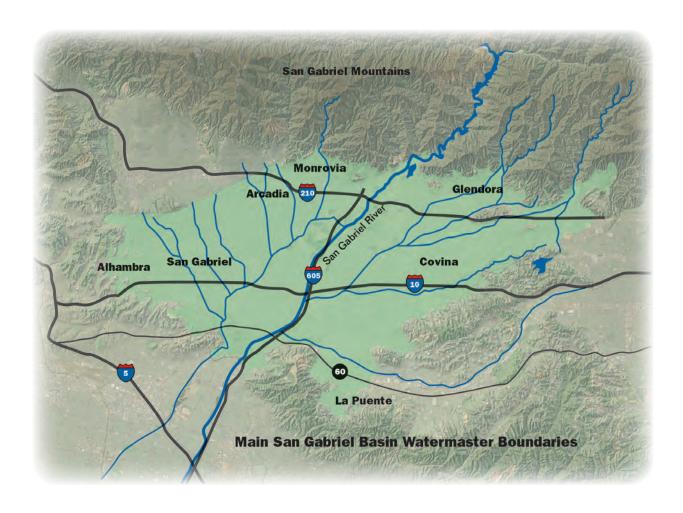
